

2025 Spring Semester Classes



Each Credit hour will be a 50-minute session. Classes will not be available online.

Church Education I – 2 Credit Hours (Pastor Shiflett on Monday 6:00 – 8:00 PM)

A church is different from any other institution and deserves our dedicated effort to learn how to properly do God's work. In this class, we will begin to explain some of the things that are critical to the proper functioning of a New Testament local church. You will be involved in and learn a variety of aspects of church work.

Old Testament Survey II – 2 Credit Hours (James Leeder on Monday 8:00 – 10:00 PM)

The Old Testament Survey provides an overview of the entire Old Testament. In this course, you'll learn how the various books fit together, giving a historical perspective, and laying a foundation for interpreting all of the Scripture. You'll also learn about identifying ways to use material that can help you in your daily lives.

Bible Doctrine IV – 1 Credit Hour (Pastor Shiflett on Tuesday 6:00 – 7:00 PM)

This class will deal with the in-depth study of the fundamental doctrines of the Bible. This class will be taught every semester for all three years.

Biblical Counseling – 1 Credit Hour (Carlo Leto on Tuesday 7:00 – 8:00 PM)

In Biblical counseling, you will learn the fundamentals of counseling from a Biblical perspective. Each situation you encounter will be different and knowing how to handle that, based on God's Word, will help you to be more of a help to those seeking counsel from you.

An Overview of the Book of Genesis – 2 Credit Hours (Carlo Leto on Tuesday 8:00 – 10:00 PM)

From the creation account of Genesis 1 through the death of Joseph in Genesis 50, the book of Genesis provides foundational theological insights and biblical principles from which students will glean applications and understanding for their personal spiritual journey with Christ. This study primarily focuses on observations of creation, the fall of man, Noah's flood, the foundation of God's covenant with Israel and the lives of the patriarchs.

Prison Epistles – 2 Credit Hours (Brian Birner on Thursday 6:00 – 8:00 PM)

This course will be an expository study of Paul's epistles from his first imprisonment, including Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Philemon. This course will cover the historical context, structural organization, doctrinal truths, and practical applications of each of these epistles.

Discipleship – 1 Credit Hour (Caleb Kasprzyk on Thursday 8:00 – 9:00 PM)

This course explores the process of bringing a new convert into becoming a fruitful disciple of Jesus Christ. Emphasis is placed on becoming that disciple personally as well as becoming one who disciples' others.

☐ **Christian Character and Ethics – 1 Credit Hour (Caleb Kasprzyk on Thursday 9:00 – 10:00 PM)**

This study will cover Biblical principles for the necessity and development of Christian Character and Ethics. The character of a Christian is their Christian testimony. A Christian with a negative testimony is as effective as sails on a sailboat being full of holes. We all need to develop and maintain the Christian character that will honor the Lord in every situation that comes into our lives and ministry.
